Step 1:

From Connecticut and Rhode Island: Take 84 West to 87 North (exit 7 S in Newburg, NY), then follow step 2.

From Massachusetts, Up-States New York, Mains, New Hampshire: Find your way to highway 87 South in New York, then follow step 2.

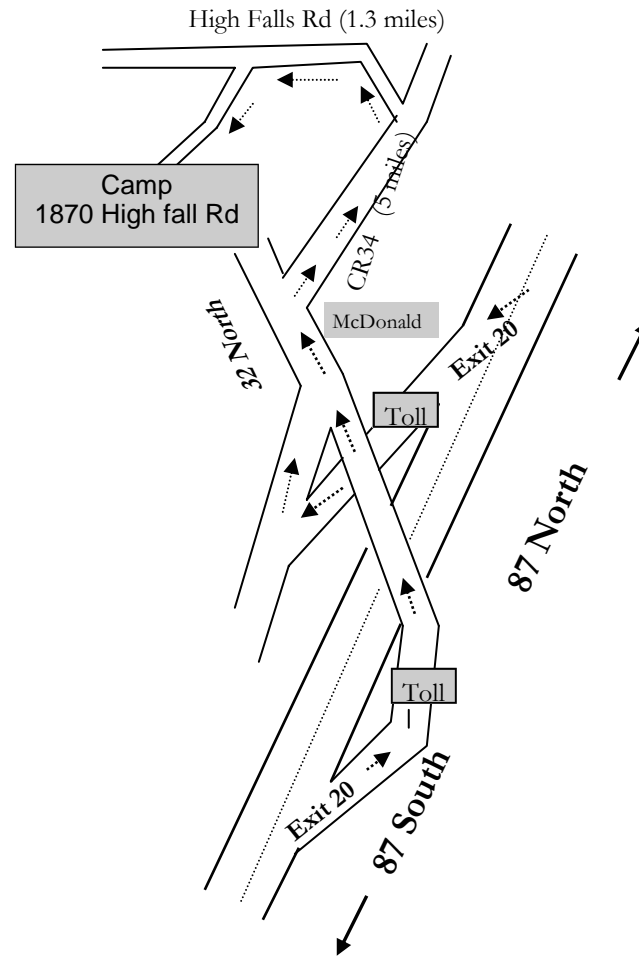
From Pennsylvania: Find your way to highway 87 North (New York), then follow step 2.

From New York, New Jersey: Find your way to highway 87 North of New York, then follow step 2.

Step 2:

From 87, take exit 20, to Route 32 North. Go about 1.8 miles from toll both, you'll see "CR 34 & Golf cause" signs, turn right to Old King Highway or CR 34. Keep going about 5 miles. Look for High Falls Road, turn left to High Falls Road. Continue about 1.3 miles our property is there. We will post some signs. **(1870 Hightfalls Road, Catskill, NY 12414)**
